Please join us in welcoming Kate Reinsma of Liberty University as she gives an informal presentation of Cameroon Baptist Convention’s NEEP-funded evaluation, “The effectiveness and acceptability of the Nutrition Improvement Programme on infant and young child feeding and nutritional status.” This study evaluated the effectiveness of integrating the Nutrition Improvement Programme into maternity, antenatal, infant welfare, and HIV clinical services through quantitative measurements of infant feeding practices and children’s nutritional status. The team also evaluated the acceptability of infant feeding counselling among caregivers and nutrition counsellors through focus group discussions. Furthermore, the team analysed the cost of scaling up the Nutrition Improvement Programme.
